### REQUIREMENTS AT A GLANCE

This program is open to UNC Greensboro undergraduate students pursuing a BS in Accounting who have:

- ✓ Earned at least 30 credit hours at UNCG
- ✓ Junior standing or higher
- ✓ Cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better
- ✓ Accounting GPA of 3.5 based on a minimum of nine credit hours of accounting classes at UNCG
- ✓ Grade of "B" or higher in ACC 318 - Intermediate Accounting I

### HOW IT WORKS

Students admitted to the AMP may apply a maximum of six credit hours of graduate-level coursework towards completion of both the undergraduate and graduate degrees, provided that they earn a grade of "B" (3.0) or better in the course and fulfill graduate-level requirements.
