Average Program Cost:

MS in Accounting (Accounting Majors)

On Campus

- In-State: \$16,000
- Out-of-State: \$34,000

Assumes 30 credit hours of full-time study for 1 year.

Online

- In-State: \$16,000
- Out-of-NC: \$24,500
- Out-of-State: \$38,500

Assumes 30 credit hours of part-time study for 2 years.

MS in Accounting (Non-Accounting Majors)

On Campus

- In-State: \$22,500
- Out-of-State: \$47,500

Assumes 42 credit hours of full-time study for 1½ years.

Online

- In-State: \$22,000
- Out-of-NC: \$34,000
- Out-of-State: \$53,000

Assumes 42 credit hours of part-time study for 2½ years.

Taxation Certificate

On Campus

- In-State: \$7,000
- Out-of-State: \$16,500

Online

- In-State: \$6,500
- Out-of-NC: \$10,000
- Out-of-State: \$15,500

Assumes 12 credit hours of part-time study for 1 year.

The Outside-of-NC rate applies to students located outside of the state taking online classes. The Out-of-State rate applies to students taking classes while located within the state, but are not residents of NC as determined by the Residency Determination Service (ncresidency.org).

These estimated program costs include tuition and fees based on the 2021-2022 Graduate Tuition and Fee Schedule and do not include the cost of textbooks or student health insurance. - ✓ TOEFL/IELTS for non-native English speakers
