At the Bryan School of Business and Economics we are committed to increasing our students' access to excellence and ensuring their success. We prove this every day through our robust career and professional development offerings as well as our vast selection of flexible, customizable, and nationally-ranked undergraduate programs.

And this commitment applies to all Bryan School students — more than a third of whom study online.

Wherever they are in their academic or professional journeys, students who enter any of our **16 online undergraduate programs** have the opportunity to build a foundation of business knowledge that applies across organizations of any size or scope — all at their own pace and on their own schedule.

DID YOU KNOW?

- Online students **save about \$1,000** in fees per semester compared to their full-time on campus peers.
- There are no additional fees for the use of academic and professional resources. This includes **free** tutoring, academic skills and success workshops, a writing center, speaking center, distance librarian, math help center, and career coaching. All are available in a virtual format at no cost.
- Online students are eligible for **the same financial aid** they would receive if they were pursuing the degree as a commuting student.
- Once students are at 12 hours, they are considered full-time, and there is **no additional** charge for taking additional courses. You can take up to a total of 18 credit hours for the same cost of 12 credit hours.
- Students **don't have to study full-time** to receive financial aid. All can be used if at least half time (6 hours) and Pell Grants can apply even for a single course.
- Financial Aid is also available for **summer terms**. At UNCG summer consists of two sessions. Students can take one class in each and be considered half-time for aid.
- For those self-paying, UNCG offers a payment plan to **any student** (there are no qualifying factors, meaning anyone can opt in).
- Many employers offer a generous tuition reimbursement program have you checked into yours?
- Tuition reimbursement at or below \$5,250 is not taxable.

TUITION RATES & ESTIMATED PROGRAM COSTS

Tuition rates and fees are published at **Spartan Central**. The published charts display tuition rates and fees by credit hour on a per semester basis. To calculate tuition costs, students must know their planned study format, how many credit hours they plan to enroll in each semester, and how many semesters it will take for them to complete their program of interest.

For many undergraduate students, cost is not easy to estimate depending on their given situation, be it online, transfer, part-time, et cetera. We recommend connecting with our undergraduate recruitment team for either an unofficial transfer credit evaluation, plan of study, or both. That will give prospective students a much clearer idea of where they stand.

FINANCIAL AID & SCHOLARSHIPS

To be considered for most types of aid, including **Federal Student Loans**, all students must complete the Free Application for **Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To be eligible for aid through the FAFSA,** students must:

- Be accepted to or enrolled in an eligible degree or certificate program.
- Be making satisfactory progress toward earning their degree or certificate.
- Be enrolled in courses required to complete their degree or certificate.
- Be a U.S. citizen or an eligible non-citizen.

Undergraduate first-degree students include all students pursuing their first bachelor's degree, regardless of if they have already received an Associate's degree. They also must:

- Be enrolled at least half time (6 credit hours per semester) for most types of aid.
- Maintain a cumulative 2.0 GPA for all courses.
- Complete their degree within 150% of the required credit hours. (Financial aid is capped at a maximum of 180 attempted hours.)

First degree undergraduate students are eligible for federal loans, federal grants, state grants, and institutional grants/scholarships. There are **scholarships** available specifically for first year students and also many **scholarships** for continuing students through UNCG academic departments.

We encourage students to look at outside scholarship programs for even more opportunities.

APPLICATION PROCESS

To request Federal Financial Aid, students should submit the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).** Once admitted to an undergraduate program, the financial aid office will contact eligible applicants with a current FAFSA on file.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarship opportunities are limited and highly competitive, and early application is strongly encouraged. **There is no separate application for scholarships**, and all incoming students are considered for scholarships based on their undergraduate program application.

Bryan School scholarships range from \$500 – \$2,500 per year. Scholarship decisions are made after admissions decisions and notifications are sent throughout the year. For maximum scholarship consideration, applicants should submit their complete undergraduate program application as soon as possible.

THIRD PARTY & MILITARY SPONSORSHIP

Note that payments may be made on a student's behalf by certain third parties that have arranged to pay all or a portion of a student's bill. These payments may come from state and federal agencies, international embassies, military agencies, pre-paid college programs, employers or other organizations that have been granted special billing arrangements by the University. Students sponsored by a third party may be able to defer payment of a balance covered by the third party. Military-affiliated students may also be eligible for a military deferment payment plan to cover charges not covered by their sponsor.
